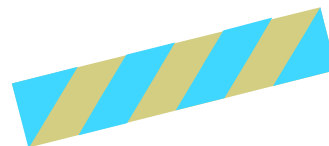

Staying in a shelter can effect an animal for a very long time.

Many shelters are not sanitary and good places for animals to stay. Animals that come in sweet and healthy often leave sick and timid. Also, about 84% of animals going into shelters now do not come back out alive. In some shelters across the country, the euthanasia rate is as high as 94%. Animal cruelty is growing

worse and worse all of the time with the help of dog fighting, puppy mills and careless pet owners. Fostering gives animals a second chance. Animals are found new and responsible owners who pay a relatively small adoption fee.



Most shelter pets come fixed and with all their shots and vaccinations. Shelter pets are not unwanted. They are simply unlucky. Another good thing about adopting a pet from an animal shelter is that they might already be house broken and know some basic commands such as sit or lie down. To me, fostering has only two big downsides-losing a foster and cleaning up after the pets. Sometimes a foster is too sick or old to make it. It is sad for everyone to lose a pet or foster pet. Luckily, we have only lost 3 of our foster kittens and we have fostered over 150! We have lost no puppies because they are a little stronger in general. Madagascar 2: Escape to Africa is an action adventure comedy movie. My favorite character was Alex the lion voiced by Ben Stiller ,who has a rivalry

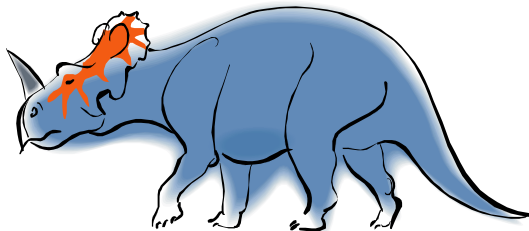
